Baked Goods Instructions

AFTER JUDGING, THERE WILL BE A SAMPLE PIECE OF THE CAKES AND THE BREADS ON DISPLAY.

THE CAKES AND THE BREADS WILL BE SOLD BY THE OPEN CLASS.

NO PREPARED MIXES (except for classes 10, 11, 12 and 13) are to be used in the Baked Goods Department.

- A. Everything in this department must be out of the pan.
- B. All cakes must be displayed on heavy covered cardboard, whole cake.
- C. Everything (except cakes) must be in plastic bags.
- D. Each family member must make/mix their own batter for cookies or cakes. CAN NOT enter two entries from the same batch.

Combination of quick & yeast bread, with a total of 6 loaves or rolls
Individually wrapped in clear plastic and displayed in basket
In a small box bring one of each kind (displayed in the basket) individually wrapped in clear plastic and identified - so the judge won't need to disturb items displayed in the basket. | \$5.00 | \$3.00 | \$ 1.00 |

Cookies must be exhibited in a decorated one gallon jar
The jar should be filled with at least 6 kinds of cookies, individually wrapped in clear plastic. In a small box bring one of each kind of cookie (displayed in the jar) individually wrapped in clear plastic and identified so the judge won't need to open the cookie jar. | \$5.00 | \$3.00 | \$ 1.00 |

Preserved Foods Instructions

- A. Preserved items are to be displayed in regulation canning jars.
- B. All rings must be free of rust.
- C. Entries **MUST** be in compliance with current USDA guidelines (available at your local Extension office) for safe food preservation.
- D. All preservation rules must be followed or item will not be judged.
- E. No jars will be opened for judging, except to verify C and D at judge's discretion.
- F. Classes can be divided at the judges or superintendent's discretion.
- G. Judging will be based on:

Appearance	60%
Selection of Products	25%
Container	15%

Preservation Tips

Jellies:	Clear, translucent, hold shape, tender & free of crystals, use correct head space.
Preserves:	Small, whole fruit or uniformly sized, medium - large pieces of fruit in clear, heavy, slightly jellied syrup.
Jams & Butters:	Soft fruit & syrup of good bright color, thick & of good consistency.
Fruits & Vegetables:	Jars should be full, have proper head space, liquid clear, & free of sediment, uniform size of food pieces & color, clear & fresh looking.
Pickles:	Foods prepared in a seasoned vinegar mixture or a brine solution to preserve them and/or impart flavor.
Relishes:	Chopped vegetables and/or fruits cooked in vinegar and seasonings.

DRIED FOODS INSTRUCTIONS

- A. Dried foods to be exhibited in zip lock bags, with 5 pieces of meat or ½ cup of other dried foods.
- B. Food selected for drying should be fresh, firm, at peak of ripeness, free from bruises.
- C. Pieces should be of uniform size and dryness, with no moisture showing when piece is broken.
- D. Avoid the sun-drying method (not reliable) and the sulfuring method (dangerous).
- E. Label dried food articles with name of dried food and date dried, method of pretreatment, drying method & drying time.
- F. Bags will be opened for judging.
