Rules and Regulations

\$465 Prize Money

1. Official Crop Data Cards may be obtained from Larry Hittle, Alan Rush or area elevators. Official Data Cards must be completed prior to entry.
2. Entry shall be accompanied with the completed official Crop Data Card.
3. Entries must be delivered to the Show Arena at the Cowley County Fairgrounds, Winfield, between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on **Monday, July 23rd, 2018**
4. All wheat exhibits shall be produced during the current year.
5. All exhibits shall be of COMBINE RUNS ONLY. Samples shall consist of a minimum of 10 pounds of wheat. One gallon of this wheat will be exhibited, the remainder will be used for the judging.
6. ANY ENTRY WHICH HAS BEEN PICKED AND/OR SCREENED WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.
7. Limitations of entry. Each farmer is limited to two entries, each of a different variety. Only one premium will be awarded any individual.
8. Decision of the judges will be final.
9. In case of tie, premiums will be added together and divided by the number of entrants tying.
10. All exhibits of wheat become the property of the Cowley County Fair Assn.
11. Samples will be judged by the following criteria:

Protein	250 points
General appearance of samples	200 points
Test Weight	350 points
Dockage Factor	150 points
Completeness of Official Crop Data Card	50 points
